## Scottish Geodiversity Forum Annual Report 2018

This has been a year of recovery and consolidation, after the intense activity of 2017. Work has continued on our key aims: to promote Scotland's geodiversity, widen the profile of geodiversity and influence national and local policies. We have worked to promote Scotland's

Geodiversity Charter, now supported by 88 signatories. Our email forum has shared news, information and events with members, and we have maintained the scottishgeology.com website and an active twitter presence.

The Forum has continued its membership of Scottish Environment LINK, contributing to the Landscape subgroup, and maintained representation on the GeoConservation UK Executive Committee and the Geological Society's Geoconservation Committee. We have engaged with a range of other organisations, including the Scottish geological societies, museums, universities and geoparks, to consider the creation of a successor organisation to the Forum, a sustainable membership charity that will promote and celebrate Scotland's geology and its value to society.

## The 2<sup>nd</sup> Hugh Miller Writing Competition and Conversations In Stone book

The second Hugh Miller Writing Competition gathered in rich, diverse and inspiring prose and poetry entries. This unique writing competition is organised by Lara Reid on behalf of the Forum and the Friends of Hugh Miller. It is open to all, and this year invited prose and poetry entries inspired by recent fossil discoveries made in Scotland. Prizes were awarded in a well-attended ceremony at the Scottish Poetry Library in Edinburgh. We are grateful to Scottish Natural Heritage for funding in association with promotion of Scotland's Fossil Code.

The Forum and The Friends of Hugh Miller, together with generous support from The Andrew Tannahill Fund for the Furtherance of Scottish Literature, Edinburgh Geological Society and Scottish Natural Heritage, have prepared an anthology – *Conversations in Stone: A Celebration of Hugh Miller's Legacy* – that brings together all of the winning entries from the first two competitions, along with new writings by leading authors including James Robertson and Robert Macfarlane, and Miller experts Bob Davidson and Michael Taylor.
